

Sentence types

Remember

Different sentence types are used for different reasons. Statements give facts, opinions or ideas. For example: 'Trees are green.' Questions ask for information. They end with a question mark. For example: 'Where do you live?' Commands give instructions. For example: 'Walk quickly.' Exclamations show strong feelings. They often start with 'what' or 'how' and end with an exclamation mark. For example: 'How happy you are!'


