| Tips for reading with children |
| If your child pauses at a word, remind them to 'sound-talk the word' or to 'say the sounds' and then 'blend them together' [e.g. <i>p-i-n pin</i>]. |
| Always prompt children to use their phonic knowledge and skills to decode words. Don't ask them to look for a clue in the picture, guess or rely on memory. |
| Children might recognise some words automatically without sound-talking and blending them. This is a good thing, as it is a sign of reading fluency. They do not need to go back and sound-talk these words. |
| Say the sounds |
| These are the focus sounds that your child will practise in this book. Encourage them to point to each letter or group of letters and say the sound. |
