## Notes for parents and other helpers

## **Enjoying and talking about the story**

- CLL 1 listening and responding to stories;CLL 2 using talk to organise thinking;CLL 4 understanding of stories;NLS T9
- Remember that the most important thing is to have fun and enjoy the story.
- Make sure that you are both in the mood for a story before you begin.
- Discuss the title and the cover. Ask, 'I wonder what the toys are laughing at?' Build a sense of anticipation.
- Discuss what is happening in the pictures, including those details not mentioned in the text: Sweep tidying up (page 3), the mess made by the toys (page 6 onwards), and Max the monster's jelly (page 3 onwards). All these are important later.
- Show the child how to talk about stories, encouraging him or her to join in. Ask, 'Why is the
  monster smiling?' (page 4 onwards), 'Why doesn't Boris tell the joke to Tilda?' (page 10).
- Have fun reading the words with interesting sounds (pages 6, 8, 9 and 11).
- Encourage the child to predict what will happen after page 11: 'What will Sweep say?', 'What will the toys do?'
- Discuss the ending: 'I thought Sweep was going to tell the toys off ... Did you think that?' Or talk about the funniest part of the story.
- Link the story to the child's experience and to his or her sense of humour. Ask, 'What do you
  think the jelly joke was?' (page 3). Suggest 'What lies in a pram and wobbles?' (a jelly baby) or
  'What do you call a helicopter with a plate of jelly in it?' (a jellycopter) or make up jokes of
  your own!

## Playing with sounds – letter sounds

CLL 3 hear and say initial sounds; CLL 4 exploring sounds; NLS W2; W4

- Read the story aloud, exaggerating words that begin with the same sound:
   He wibbled and wobbled and wiggled and waggled. He wobbled about with glee!
   (page 6).
- On each page, ask the child if he or she notices words beginning with the same sound. For example (page 3), ""Joke" starts with a "j" sound. Is there another word with that sound?"
- Play 'I-Spy', asking, 'Can you spot something else in this picture that starts with the sound
  " "?'
- Invent more 'jolly jokes' about a '<u>b</u>ear and a <u>b</u>umble <u>b</u>ee' or a '<u>c</u>aterpillar on a <u>c</u>abbage', for example.
