Notes for teachers

The first two sections of this book are designed for use with either the Schofield & Sims First Illustrated Dictionary or the Schofield & Sims First Dictionary. The activities will work equally well with either book – but please note that the activities on pages 10 and 30 will elicit different answers depending on the book used. The third section is designed for use with the Schofield & Sims First Thesaurus.

The First Dictionary and Thesaurus Activities help children:

- · to learn to use a dictionary as a source of reference
- · to develop the skills and knowledge that they need for using a dictionary and a thesaurus

The activities provided give children graded practice in implementing all the skills that they acquire as they work through the book. A full list of the learning objectives is given on page 47.

Choose between the **First Illustrated Dictionary** and the **First Dictionary** according to which books you have available and/or how much support individual children need.

Section by section

This book is divided into three sections, as follows:

- Using a dictionary: first steps
 - This section is in line with the end of Year 1 objectives and could be used as revision at the start of Year 2.
- Using a dictionary: learning more
 - This section is in line with the end of Year 2 objectives and provides activities that will best suit children who are nearing the end of Key Stage 1.
- Using a thesaurus

This section is best completed once children are already familiar with using a dictionary. It is aimed at children who are nearing the end of Key Stage 1 and are beginning to understand and use more adventurous vocabulary.

The First Dictionary and Thesaurus Activities may also be used to support work with older children.

Page by page

Each page has a clear learning point, which is introduced and explained at the top of the page.





Look The explanation is followed by an activity that encourages the child to refer to his or her dictionary or thesaurus and apply the learning in practice.



Check Check points at the foot of every page encourage children to check that they have understood the learning points. The check points are clear statements beginning with the words I can or I know; they sum up clearly the main focus of the activity and will help children to consolidate what they have learned. Tell the children to tick the check point box when they understand and can apply what they have learned on the page.
