Introduction

Punctuation shows which words go together to form chunks of meaning. This helps the reader to understand the exact sense of what is written.

In this book, you will find information on all the main punctuation marks, starting with basic sentence punctuation and ending with more complex punctuation, such as colons and semicolons. You will also learn more about writing sentences, because understanding how sentences work helps you understand when and why punctuation is needed.

Finding your way around this book

Before you start using this book, write your name in the name box on the first page.

Then decide how to begin. If you want a complete course on punctuation, you should work right through the book from beginning to end. Another way to use the book is to dip into it when you want to find out about a particular topic, such as apostrophes. The Contents page will help you to find the pages you need.
