These questions test your knowledge of words with more than one meaning.

Here are two pairs of words. Choose from the five possible answers on the left the **one** word that goes equally well with **both** the word pairs. Underline the word.

cost good fine joyful price (fee, penalty) (well, happy)

Read the words in brackets. Think about the meanings and how they are connected. Look at each of the five words in turn. Look for a connection with the word in brackets.

- Is **cost** connected with **fee**, **penalty**? Yes all are to do with paying money.
- Is **cost** connected with **well**, **happy**? No
- Is good connected with fee, penalty? No.
- Is fine connected with fee, penalty?
 Yes all are to do with paying money.
- Is fine connected with well, happy?Yes all are to do with feeling good.

Answer: cost good fine joyful price



Think of different pronunciations and meanings of the words. For example, **bow** can mean 'a knot with two loops' or 'to bend forward from the waist'. The meaning depends on the pronunciation.
